Cork County Senior & Intermediate Championship Formats 2022 & 2023

Following a comprehensive review process throughout 2018 and 2019, revised County Championship formats were approved at County Committee for a period of two years, 2020 and 2021. Further changes were approved subsequently in 2020 due to constraints caused by Covid-19. In 2021, a format was implemented with a number of the amendments which proved successful in 2020. A similar format is now proposed for 2022 and 2023.

- **104 Club teams** in total in the County Senior & Intermediate Championships by 2023, (52 in Hurling and 52 in Football).

*LIHC is to be abolished at the end of 2022 with IAHC then increasing to 16 teams.

Format for selection of extra teams in IAHC is as follows:

- 2022 JAHC (Junior A Hurling Championship) winners
- Both 2022 LIHC Finalists
- Both 2022 LIHC losing semi-finalists will play-off. The winner will be promoted to LIHC. The loser will play the bottom placed team in IAHC 2022 for the final LIHC place in 2023.

- **Sequence of Group Games**

- Round 1 (A v B, C v D)
- Round 2 (A v D, B v C)
- Round 3 (A v C, B v D)

- **Placings as per Rule 6.21**

- The following Regulations shall apply as per Rule 6.21 of the Official Guide:

(a) League results shall be credited as follows: 2 points for a win, and one for a draw.

(b) If a Team is Disqualified or Retires during the course of the League Stage, its played Games shall stand and its unplayed Games shall be awarded to the Opposing Teams.

(c) Except where provided for otherwise in these Rules, in County Bye-Law or in Competition Regulation, when Teams finish with equal points for Qualification for the Concluding Stages, or for Promotion or Relegation, the tie shall be decided by the following means and in the order specified:

- (i) Where two Teams only are involved - the outcome of the meeting of the two Teams in the previous game in the Competition;
- (ii) Scoring Difference (subtract total Scores Against from total Scores For);
- (iii) Highest Total Score For;
- (iv) A Play-Off.

Exceptions to (c):

(1) In relation to means (ii) and (iii) above, if the accumulated scores of a team, so involved, are affected by a disqualification, loss of game on a proven objection, retirement or walk over, the tie shall be decided by a Play-Off

- **Qualification** two teams from each group qualify for the semi-finals / quarter-finals as outlined in each grade below. **Relegation** ‘one up one down’.
- **Divisions / Colleges** one team to enter at quarter-final stage of the Premier Senior Hurling and Football Championships. Under General Rule, there will be a requirement to have 16 teams or less in all Senior and Intermediate County championships in 2023. Therefore, the Divisions and Colleges competition will be again required to run off separately in 2023, but perhaps with increased delineation. Further discussion to follow
- **Seedings** are as follows:

In PSHC and PSFC the finalists from the previous year along with the top ranked semi-finalist (based on the group stages) are designated as A seeds. The remaining three teams to emerge from the group stages are designated as B seeds. All remaining teams are designated as C/D seeds in no particular order.

In SAHC, SAFC, PIHC, PIFC, IAHC, LIHC, the losing finalist from the previous year, the team relegated from the grade above, along with the top ranked semi-finalist (based on the group stages) will be designated as A seeds. The remaining three teams to emerge from the group stages will be designated as B seeds. All remaining teams will be designated as C/D seeds in no particular order.

In IAFC, the losing finalist from the previous year, the team relegated from the grade above, along with both semi-finalists will be designated as A seeds. The remaining four teams to emerge from the group stages will be designated as B seeds. All remaining teams will be designated as C/D seeds in no particular order.

- **Draw Format & Procedure** In all competitions with 12 teams (3 groups of 4), draws will take place as follows: There will be 3 Groups to be filled (labelled 1 to 3). There will be three A seeds, three B seeds, six C/D seeds. Firstly, the three A seeds will be placed in the bowl. Each will be drawn and placed in Groups 1 to 3 in order. Then, the three B seeds will be

placed in the bowl. Each will be drawn and placed in Groups 1 to 3 in order. Then, the six C/D seeds will be placed in the bowl. Two will be drawn each time labelled C and D, and placed in Groups 1 to 3 in order.

- Exception For IAFC where there are 16 teams there will instead be four A seeds placed in the bowl. Each will be drawn and placed in Groups 1 to 4 in order. Then, the four B seeds will be placed in the bowl. Each will be drawn and placed in Groups 1 to 4 in order. Then, the eight C/D seeds will be placed in the bowl. Two will be drawn each time labelled C and D, and placed in Groups 1 to 4 in order.
- Junior Championships – the deadline for the completion of Junior A & B Divisional Championships will be Sunday, September 4th. One team from each Division will progress to the County Quarter-finals in both grades.
- County U19 league and championship competitions will be organised by the County CCC in 2022 and 2023, based on the Rebel Óg structures and regions and matches will be played midweek to avoid Adult and Minor fixtures at the weekend. League Groups of four will start on Wed, March 30th and clubs will be asked to play these league games without County Minor and U20 players. All teams will play a cup or a plate semi-final giving a minimum of four leagues games in each code. A knockout championship will begin on July 13th and run on a weekly basis to the end of August, to finish before the return to school / college. Draft calendar as follows:

- There will be no County U21 competition organised in 2022. However, Divisions will be permitted to organise local U21 competitions at their own discretion with the proviso that Adult, U19 and Minor fixtures takes precedence at all times.
- Independent teams will be permitted for U19 competitions subject to County Committee approval. Independent teams will be permitted for U21 competitions, subject to Divisional Committee approval and subsequent County Committee ratification.

Qualification Two teams will progress from each group of four to the play-off stages. This will result in six teams qualifying for the play-off stages with the two top group winners qualifying for the semi-finals and the remaining group winner and the three second -placed teams qualifying for the quarter-finals.

A repeat pairing is possible in the quarter finals in (a) 3v6 above. If this arises 3 will instead play 5 and 4 will play 6. Repeat pairings in semi-finals will be avoided, with pairings being adjusted where necessary.

Relegation LIHC is to be abolished at the end of 2022 with IAHC then increasing to 16 teams.

Format for selection of extra teams in IAHC is as follows:

- 2022 JAHC (Junior A Hurling Championship) winners
- Both 2022 LIHC Finalists
- Both 2022 LIHC losing semi-finalists will play-off. The winner will be promoted to LIHC. The loser will play the bottom placed team in IAHC 2022 for the final LIHC place in 2023.

Championship Regulations

(1) Correspondence

All correspondence in relation to fixtures is to be submitted from the Club Secretary's official email to the County Secretary's official email administrator.cork@gaa.ie

(2) A postponement for the death of a player on the panel or a club officer will be granted, with a re-fixture to take place within 72 hours. All other requests for postponements will be considered by and are at the discretion of the CCC.

(3) The Colleges, namely UCC and MTU will submit a panel list with a maximum of four players per Division by March 1st annually, along with the relevant permits. The players listed will be then tied to the College and will not be eligible to play with their Division for the current season. If a Division does not field in the County Championship in a particular year, there will be no closing date and no limit on the number of players that can be nominated from that Division.

(4) The decision to apply Winner-on-the-Day regulations is at the discretion of the CCC. However, as per General Rule, there is no scope to adapt the format.

(5) The National flag is to be flown for all Championship games and pitches are to be properly lined and flagged.

(6) Team panels admitted to field area is limited to a maximum of 30 players, 15 starting players and 15 substitutes. This limit also applies to listing in the match programmes.

A maximum of 40 persons (including a maximum of 30 players) will be admitted to the playing area before and during the game. If more than 40 persons from either club are present in Field Area before or during the game, the Event Controller of the game is requested to report this to referee/fourth official. The referee and Event Controller should record this breach in their match report.

The maximum number of Officials (including two Water Carriers (Maor Uisce) per team (Football) or Water/Hurley Carriers (Maor Uisce/Camán) per team (Hurling) is to be 12 persons. All Water Carriers (Football) or Water/Hurley Carriers (Hurling) must be aged 18 or over. (Exception: There will be no water carriers while Covid-19 protocols remain in place.)

(7) With the exception of the Bainisteoir, the Medical Officer and the two Water or Water/Hurley Carriers (who are to be provided by their Club with distinguishing armbands/bibs), all Substitutes and Officials, shall remain seated at all times during play. The Bainisteoir may go along the sideline between the two 45m lines to issue instructions, after which he must return to the area in front of his own team's dug out. He must not enter the field for any purpose.

(8) **Injuries.** A Team Medical Official, having obtained the expressed permission of the Referee (who may delegate authority to his linesmen), may enter the field to examine an injured player. He is not at this point, to take a medical kit onto the field. No other Team Official shall enter the field of Play for this purpose. The practice of a number of Team Officials/water carriers running onto the field to examine an injury is strictly prohibited.

Minor injuries must be treated off the field. If a blood substitute is required, the substitute may not enter the field of play until the injured player has left and the referee/fourth official has signalled his approval.

(9) The Water Carriers – (Football) or Hurley/Water Carriers – (Hurling) (who are to be provided by their Club with distinguishing bibs) are permitted per team.

- Such carriers are to be positioned outside the 20m and 65m lines
- Water carriers are not permitted to enter the field of play.
- Players must only approach the sideline to receive water from a Water Carrier.

In Hurling, Water/Hurley Carriers may enter the field with a replacement hurley, when necessary, but may not enter the field of play with water at any stage - players must only approach the sideline to receive water from a Water Carrier.

(Exception: There will be no water carriers while Covid-19 protocols remain in place.)

(10) Warm Up Substitutes may warm-up on the sideline area between the end line and the 20m line. A maximum of three substitutes may warm up at any one time, wearing a bib/ top, different / distinct from team jersey. No hurleys, sliotars or footballs may be used along the sideline during the warm-up.

(11) Substitute Slips are to be presented by the substitute to the Referee. This may be designated to a 4th Official if one is in place.

County Senior and Intermediate League Formats 2022 & 2023

A restructuring of the County Leagues was planned at the end of 2020 to align the league programme more appropriately with the new championship programme. With all teams now guaranteed at least three championship games, it was felt that a lesser number of league games would be appropriate. Also, the split season mean tighter timeframe and weekends could not be wasted with uneven groups. A target of ten teams per division and nine games per team was established.

Note: It is expected that Macroom GAA Club will again organise the Tom Creedon Cup on hurling league weekends, with a hurling equivalent such as the Liam Breathnach Cup, for example, being organised on football league weekends if there is sufficient demand from clubs for extra games.

Therefore, the league structure shown below is proposed. In order to restructure the leagues on a fair basis, the Divisions will be split into Groups 1A & 1B, 2A & 2B, 3A & 3B (and 3C football) for 2022. Teams are allocated based primarily on their finishing league position in 2019 and secondly on their championship status for 2022. Groups 1A and 1B are of the same standard, for example, and are evenly graded.

In 2023, six Divisions of ten teams each will be in place, based on finishing positions at end 2022.

League Play-offs 2022

In each Division, the top team will play the second placed team in the corresponding group. The top team in Group 1A for example will have home advantage and will play the second placed team in Group 1B and vice versa, with the exception of Division 3 in football where the best 2nd placed team will join the three group winners at the semi-final stage with repeat pairings to be avoided, the top two ranked teams having home advantage. All league finals will be played at neutral venues.

In each case the promoted and relegated teams will replace their relevant counterpart. Both league finalists in Group 2 will be promoted in place of the bottom team in both Division 1A and 1B. Both league finalists in Group 3 will be promoted in place of the bottom teams in Groups 2A and 2B.

League Regulations

Teams that are relegated in championships shall retain their league status as both competitions are decoupled. Teams relegated to Junior A championships will retain their position in the County Senior and Intermediate Leagues. Once County or regional Junior leagues are in place, relegation and promotion will follow.

(1) Correspondence

All correspondence in relation to fixtures is to be submitted from the Club Secretary's official email to the County Secretary's official email administrator.cork@gaa.ie

(2) Completion Dates

The completion date for the group stage is June is June 12th. League play-offs will take place on the earliest possible date thereafter. If a full weekend of games is lost due to weather, then it will be re-fixed 'en bloc' for the weekend of June 18th/19th and the deadline will be extended accordingly.

(3) Venue

The first named team has home venue, but if this venue is not available, the game will be played at the opponent's venue or at neutral venue. The national flag is to be flown for all league games and pitches are to be properly lined and flagged.

(3) Referee

Where the appointed referee fails to attend, agreement must be reached between the two clubs on a substitute referee by either tossing or by agreement. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of the league points by the club or clubs failing to agree. In the event of a referee being agreed by both clubs it is the responsibility of the club of the referee to ensure that the official report of the game is submitted within three days of the game. If the agreed referee is not a member of either participating club, the responsibility for ensuring the report is submitted shall rest with the home club.

(4) Fixtures

All fixtures listed at the start of the year are thereby ratified for the dates / times outlined.

Request for Postponement / Change

Any request for changes to the listed time and / or date must be sent from the club secretary's official email to the county secretary's official email administrator.cork@gaa.ie at least five days in advance of the fixture. No postponements shall be granted thereafter, except in exceptional circumstances.

If a fixture is to be the following criteria must be met:

- Both clubs must email administrator.cork@gaa.ie referencing the fixture involved, both outlining the same reason for change of fixture and both listing the same new agreed re-fixture date / time.

- The re-fixture date must be on / before the same date in the following month and on / before the group stage deadline. For example, a match postponed on March 15th must be re-fixed to be played on a date on or before April 15th before postponement is granted.

- If the request is approved by CCC, the new date / time becomes a ratified fixture, and the fixture list will be updated accordingly.
- All fixtures are subject to a limit of two postponements. On the third postponement, the fixture become null and void or a walkover is granted.
- If two clubs fail to agree on either postponement or a re-fixture date, the fixture stands. A club may then unilaterally request a change of fixture from the CCC for exceptional reasons, stating clearly that agreement between the clubs does not apply.

Unfulfilled Fixtures / Walkovers

- A fine of €100 per team will apply for each unfulfilled fixture, unless a walkover is given by one of the teams. Walkovers will be awarded automatically where one of the teams involved fails to fulfil or indicates their intention not to fulfil a fixture without the joint submission of an agreed re-fixture date. A fine of €200 will apply to the relevant team in each case. Disputes in relation to the non-fulfilment of a fixture will be referred to the CCC.
- If a club is disqualified or retires during the course of the league, its played games shall stand and its unplayed games awarded to the opposing teams. A fine of €200 per game will apply.
- Where clubs in the same league group are due to meet in championship later in the same year, this will not merit postponement or cancellation.

(5) Substitutions

Up to nine (9) substitutions shall be permitted in the playing of normal time in all games in the County Leagues and Secondary Competitions under the jurisdiction of Coiste Chontae Chorcaí. Rule 2.4, Rules of Specification, Official Guide, Part 2 sections (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) shall not be affected by this deviation. A maximum of three substitutes remains for extra-time in play-offs, where played.

(6) Match results by text

The Referee is responsible for returning all match results and will receive a text message prior to the commencement of the game.

(7) League Placings

The following Regulations shall apply as per Ru3 6.21 of the Official Guide:

- (a) League results shall be credited as follows: 2 points for a win, and one for a draw.
- (b) If a Team is Disqualified or Retires during the course of the League Stage, its played Games shall stand and its unplayed Games shall be awarded to the Opposing Teams.
- (c) Except where provided for otherwise in these Rules, in County Bye-Law or in Competition Regulation, when Teams finish with equal points for Qualification for the Concluding Stages, or for Promotion or Relegation, the tie shall be decided by the following means and in the order specified:
 - (i) Where two Teams only are involved - the outcome of the meeting of the two Teams in the previous game in the Competition;
 - (ii) Scoring Difference (subtract total Scores Against from total Scores For);

(iii) Highest Total Score For;

(iv) A Play-Off.

Exceptions to (c):

(1) In relation to means (ii) and (iii) above, if the accumulated scores of a team, so involved, are affected by a disqualification, loss of game on a proven objection, retirement or walk over, the tie shall be decided by a Play-Off

(8) League Play-offs 2022

In each Division, the top team will play the second placed team in the corresponding group. The top team in Group 1A for example will play the second placed team in Group 1B and vice versa, with the exception of Division 3 in football where the best 2nd placed team will join the three group winners at the semi-final stage with repeat pairings to be avoided.

In each case the promoted and relegated teams will replace their relevant counterpart. Both league finalists in Group 2 will be promoted in place of the bottom team in both Division 1A and 1B. Both league finalists in Group 3 will be promoted in place of the bottom teams in Groups 2A and 2B.

(9) Promotion / Relegation 2022

In each case the promoted and relegated teams will replace their relevant counterpart. Both league finalists in Division 2 will be promoted in place of the bottom team in both Group 1A and 1B. Both league finalists in Division 3 will be promoted in place of the bottom team in both Group 2A and 2B.

(10) League Prizes 2022

In each Division the prize fund will be as follows: Division Winners €1,000, Runners-up €500, Semi-finalists €250 each.

Extra-Time & Winner-on-the-Day Regulations

Regulations approved Ard Chomhairle on the 19th January 2019 and in accordance with Rules of Specification 3.4 & 3.6 T.O. Part 2 2019, that relevant games that finish level after normal playing times should be completed as follows:

Phase 1

- Proceed to Extra time as provided for in T.O Cuid II (two periods of ten minutes each way)

Phase 2 (Penalty Kicks/Pucks)

If still level, a “penalty competition” to decide the outcome:

- The relevant rules in T.O. Cuid II shall apply in relation to Penalty Kicks/Pucks, unless otherwise stated.
- Penalties will be taken for goals only.
- The Referee shall choose the end at which the penalty kicks/pucks will be taken. The end may be changed by the referee if it becomes unplayable during the course of the penalties.
- The Referee will ensure two goal umpires are in place at the end in which the penalty kicks/pucks are to be taken;
 - Both umpires shall position themselves on the end line at opposite side of the goals facing inwards
 - If a penalty is scored, the goal umpire, will wave the green flag once the referee has signalled
 - If the penalty is saved or missed the point umpire will signal a wide once the referee has signalled
- Each team shall register five penalty takers, a goal keeper & a substitute goal keeper with the referee and indicate in which order the penalty takers will take their penalties. (A penalty taker can also be a goalkeeper or a substitute goalkeeper.)
- The Referee shall toss a coin in the presence of the two captains to see which team will have the option of going first.
- Only players who are on the field of play at the end of Phase 1 (i.e. end of Extra Time), shall be allowed to be registered as a penalty taker or goalkeeper. Exception: The substitute goalkeeper can come from the team panel.
- A goalkeeper who is injured while the penalty kicks/pucks are being taken and is unable to continue as a goalkeeper may be replaced* by the substitute goalkeeper who has been nominated in advance, provided the referee is notified. If in the event the substitute goalkeeper also gets injured, one of the registered penalty takers may replace* the substitute goalkeeper, provided the referee is notified. (*Once replaced, the goalkeeper/ substitute goalkeeper cannot be reintroduced as a goalkeeper at a later stage)
- Subject to the conditions below both teams will take five penalty kicks/pucks which are taken alternately by the teams. The game is awarded to whichever team scores more of their five penalty kicks/pucks
 - If, before both teams have taken five penalty kicks/pucks, one team has scored more goals than the other team could score, even if they were to complete their five penalty kicks/pucks, no more penalty kicks/pucks shall be taken
 - If, after both teams have taken five penalty kicks/pucks and both teams have scored the same number of goals, the penalty competition will continue but in sudden death

format using the same five registered players until one team has scored a goal more than the other from the same number of kicks/pucks.

- In sudden death, the same sequence of penalty takers does not have to be followed as in the first round of penalty kicks/pucks.
- Each penalty kick/puck is taken by a different player. All registered players must take a penalty kick/puck before any player can take an additional penalty kick/puck.
- The referee shall signal for the penalty to be taken. The penalty kick/puck is completed when the ball stops moving, goes out of play (including over the crossbar) or a goal is scored.
- Only the players involved in the penalty taking competition, as well as the Referee, Linesmen and Umpires are permitted on the pitch. With the registered penalty takers located between the 45m & 65m lines closest to the end selected by the referee. Goalkeepers to be located 20m from the goals.
- All other players (including substitute goalkeepers), managers, officials, backroom personnel etc should be at their designated sideline area, and off the field of play when the penalty-taking competition is taking place.

Notes:

- Penalties will be taken for goals only.
- Each team shall register five penalty takers, a goal keeper & a substitute goal keeper with the referee and indicate in which order the penalty takers will take their penalties. (A penalty taker can also be a goalkeeper or a substitute goalkeeper.)
- Only players who are on the field of play at the end of Phase 1 (i.e. end of Extra Time Phase 1), shall be allowed to be registered as a penalty taker or goalkeeper.
- The substitute goalkeeper can come from the team panel.

One key point to note is as follows. The Bon Secours Football Championship is scheduled to start on the weekend of July 22nd-24th, the same weekend as the All Ireland Senior Football Final. If Cork qualify, it is expected that a bye would subsequently be given in the first round of the Munster Club Championship to Cork Clubs thus allowing our championships to be delayed accordingly.
