The first County Committee meeting of 2025 took place on Tuesday, January 21st at SuperValu Páirc Uí Chaoimh.

Management Committee

- The Progress Report, as circulated in advance, including Inter-County transfers and gradings was approved.
- An application for a new club, Na Laochra Aeracha (Seandun) was approved.
- Rebel Óg Officers for 2025 and the County Referees Committee were approved.
- Derek Connolly, Seandun and John O'Donovan, Clann na nGael were elected as County Committee Representatives to the Management Committee.
- Denis Kelleher, Glanmire and John Crean, Muskerry were elected as the County Committee Representatives to the 2025 Congress delegation.
