The ninth County Committee meeting of 2025 took place on Tuesday, September 2nd at SuperValu Páirc Uí Chaoimh.

Management Committee

- The Progress Report, as circulated in advance, including recent suspensions, appeals, gradings, transfers and sanctions was approved.
- A Report on recent CCC matters was presented by the Chairperson of the CCC, Noel O'Callaghan. It was noted that attendances for the first two rounds of the County Championship were up 15% on 2024.
- Cork GAA will now be providing administrative support to the Cork Post-Primary Schools Committee. Well wishes were passed to Neil O'Keeffe on his recent retirement.

Independent Teams

- A lengthy and balanced discussion took place with regards to the Revised Report of the Independent Teams Review Group.
- The two representatives on the Monitoring Committee were elected, they were Caroline Donegan, St. Oliver Plunkett's and Brian O'Regan, Shanballymore.
- A vote also took place on various recommendations outlined on the circulated document. All of which were
 passed, which will mean that Independent teams will only be approved from Under 13 to Under 18 other
 than in exceptional circumstances.

Club Developments

- A proposed construction of an AstroTurf facility at Castlelyons GAA Club was approved.
- Reminders were given to clubs to ensure that get their Club Trustees in order before the December 31st deadline.

Inter-County Appointments

- The following Inter-County selection teams were approved, Management of Cork Teams for 2026.
