Management Committee

- The Progress Report, as circulated in advance, including recent suspensions, gradings, transfers and sanctions was approved.
- A Report on recent CCC matters was presented by the Chairperson of the CCC, Noel O'Callaghan.
- A report on the Special Congress was given by the Rúnaí, Kevin O'Donovan.
- The Chairperson noted that the Independent Teams Monitoring Committee were currently considering applications for 2026.
- The Rúnaí noted the recent appointment of Daniel Lane as Cork GAA Operations Manager.
