



Cork County Committee Bulletin

05/05/2026

The fifth County Committee meeting of 2026 took place on Tuesday, May 5th at SuperValu Páirc Uí Chaoimh.

Management Committee / CCC

- The Progress Report, including recent transfers, suspensions and gradings was approved.
- A number of club delegates raised the matter of changes made to the Player Injury Fund and the potential knock-on financial implications that it may have for a number of clubs. The Rúnaí outlined the recent changes to the scheme to cater for players playing Hurling and Football with two different clubs.
- Clubs raised various queries with regards to recent tickets allocations and distribution methods, with details provided by both the Rúnaí and Operations Manager.
- The Chairperson of the CCC provided a report on the status of the County Leagues and Championships.
- Issues with some Independent Teams were outlined by the Rúnaí with various unintended consequences noted in regard to player registrations.
- Irish & Cultural Officer, John O'Mahony congratulated Carbery Rangers' Isabelle Moore who won the All-Ireland Scór Sinséar competition for solo signing.

Club Developments

- Club developments at Cloyne, Douglas, Aghada, Ballygarvan, Mallow and Ballincollig were approved.
- Clubs were reminded that all future club developments must be submitted via Foireann.

Inter-County Teams

- Recent Inter-County results and upcoming fixtures were noted.
- Following a request from Team Management the Cork versus Meath game will be played in Páirc Uí Rinn. Should Cork receive a home draw in either Round 2 or Round 3, these games will also take place in Páirc Uí Rinn.
- The negative consequences relating to the National Hurling League Final possibly taking place in September 2027 were outlined.

Commercial & Fundraising.

- The Rúnaí thanked Tom Barry and his committee for their work in delivering a successful One Cork Dublin lunch at the Clayton Hotel, Burlington Road.
- The Stand 4 Feile Golf Classic took place recently over three days in Kenmare Golf Club. Special thanks were extended to the Fundraising Committee led by Barry Coffey.
- The annual Cork GAA Clean Up Day took place on April 11th, with over 90 clubs taking part. The Sustainability Committee led by Enda Buckley were praised for their work in organising.
- The Rúnaí noted the upcoming Golf Classics in Fota, Powerscourt and the Old Head, Kinsale, all of which will be launched soon.

- Delegates raised various matter such as Cúl Camps, match officials being registered on Foireann, the improvements to the meeting public address system, car parking on matchday, matchday panels, the formation of history committee and Rebels' Bounty.
