



## **Cork County Committee Bulletin**

### **02/06/2026**

The sixth County Committee meeting of 2026 took place on Tuesday, June 2nd at SuperValu Páirc Uí Chaoimh.

#### **Management Committee / CCC**

- The Progress Report, including recent transfers, sanctions, US suspensions and gradings was approved.
- The Rúnaí outlined the recent correspondence received from the GAA regarding the Player Injury Fund, outlining the claims band and dual registration of a player playing Hurling and Football with two different clubs.
- A deviation from Rule 3.1 will be sought by County Committee on behalf of Bere Island GAA Club.
- The Chairperson of the CCC provided a report on the status of the County Leagues and Championships, noting that with almost 500 games played in the County Leagues, only one walkover has been given.
- The recent withdrawal of Duhallow from the Divisions / Colleges Hurling Championship was also noted.
- As confirmed in November 2025, Divisional U21 Championships can begin from June 26<sup>th</sup>. The County deadlines in November remain unchanged from 2025.

#### **Club Developments**

- Various club developments at Ballyclough, Ballymartle and St. James' were approved.

#### **Inter-County Teams**

- Recent Inter-County results and upcoming fixtures, along with the draw for Round 2A of the All-Ireland Senior Football Championship were noted.
- The Rúnaí confirmed that Cork GAA will seek a Hearing for Colm O'Callaghan's red card received in the recent win over Meath.
- Best wishes were passed to the Cork Senior Hurlers ahead of Sunday's Munster Hurling Final.
- Congratulations were extended to the Minor Footballers on their recent Munster Championship success.
- Club Delegates raised various ticketing queries. A review of the Board's ticketing policy will take place later in the year, in advance of the 2027 Championship.
- Following an increase of the terrace capacity to 11,200, the Rúnaí reported that extra tickets will be going to clubs with players on the panel later this week.

#### **Facilities & Commercial Activities.**

- The Rúnaí noted that the stadium is entering a busy period of events. This included the FAI WNT who face the Netherlands on June 5<sup>th</sup>, the Munster Hurling Final on June 7<sup>th</sup> and two Zach Bryan Concerts on June 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>.
- Special thanks were given to the ground staff, event team and stewards for their work at recent games and for their continued support in the upcoming events.

#### **Central and Munster Council Reports.**

- Central Council Delegate, Marc Sheehan and Munster Council Delegates, Joseph Blake and Paul McCarthy presented their reports as circulated in advance of the meeting.

#### **A.O.B**

- John Meyler, Chairperson of the GAA Hurling Advisory Committee is planning a number of trail games during the summer, full details will be circulated in advance.
- The Rebels' Bounty results for May were announced.

- An examination of the catchment areas of Northside clubs will be looked at with support from the Coaching & Games Dept.
- Cul Camp correspondence from clubs was noted.
- Ticket availability ahead of the Club Championships was discussed, with support from SuperValu and Centra stores.
- Delegates raised various matter such as ticketing, Premium Level entertainment and the Player Injury Fund.
