



Cork County Committee Bulletin

07/07/2026

The 7th County Committee meeting of 2026 took place on Tuesday, July 7th at SuperValu Páirc Uí Chaoimh.

At the beginning of the meeting, Minor Football Manager Keith Ricken and team captain Joe Miskella addressed the delegates, expressing their appreciation to the clubs and the Board for their support throughout the year.

Chairperson Pat Horgan congratulated the players and management on their outstanding achievement in winning the All-Ireland Minor Football Championship title the previous Sunday.

Management Committee / CCC

- The Progress Report, including recent transfers, US sanctions, suspensions, was approved.
- The Rúnaí answered further queries to the GAA Player Injury Fund.
- The Chairperson of the CCC provided a report on the status of the County Leagues, noting that 625 games were played with only 5 walkovers.
- The appointment of new subcommittee members for Rebel Óg West was approved.
- Three 'permission to play' permits from St. John's to Millstreet at Under 21 level were approved.

Club Developments

- Club development proposals relating to Ballydesmond, Carrigtwohill and White's Cross were approved.

Inter-County Teams

- Delegates received an update on recent inter-county results and performances from the Rúnaí.
- An Appointments Committee for underage team vacancies consisting of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary / CEO and High-Performance Manager was ratified.
- In parallel, work is also underway on the preparation of a new 'Underage Charter' ahead of next season.
- Following a request from the floor, the Cathaoirleach confirmed that a dedicated discussion on hurling will be facilitated at a future County Committee meeting.

Facilities & Commercial Activities.

- The Rúnaí reported on recent activity at SuperValu Páirc Uí Chaoimh, including the successful hosting of two Zach Bryan concerts and the FAI Women's International fixture.
- Further non-GAA games are currently under consideration.
- Annual pitch maintenance at SuperValu Páirc Uí Chaoimh is scheduled to commence in early August.
- The Rúnaí also confirmed that a suitability assessment had been completed regarding the proposed Cork Events Centre, outlining the various partners involved.
- Safety & Facilities Officer and Chief Steward, Tony McAuliffe thanked all stewards for their work in supporting the recent Zach Bryan concerts and FAI WNT fixtures.

A.O.B

- Rebels' Bounty results for June were announced.
- Delegates raised other matter such as; Hawkeye in GAA Stadia, new LED screens in Croke Park, turnstile operations at the FAI fixture, Divisions / Colleges fixtures and host venue issues.
